What is a Special Time?

Each week contains one Special Time—Set aside one night each week for a "special time" where you and your kids can have family fun together and learn valuable lessons from God's Word at the same time.

What are Breakfast Bites?

Did you know that researchers have found that how much a student eats meals with his family at home (That's right—not on the go in the car!) directly lessens his tendency toward certain behavioral, addiction, and even criminal problems that he may face later in life. The Breakfast Bites (which don't have to be used just at breakfast) are questions that can be used at any meal to create thought and discussion concerning spiritual matters.

Teaching Method

Children only remember 10% of what they hear, 20% of what they see, and 30% of what they hear and see. They are concrete learners, which means they retain 80 to 90% of what they do, touch, smell, taste, and help teach. This is the reason that *The Family Action Pack* contains a teaching style that will help your child to:

> Find it. Taste it. Touch it. Make it. Know it. Grow it. See it. Show it. Live it!

Have Fun

These sessions are set up for you to have fun leading your family into the truths of the Bible. If you're not having fun, then your children won't either.

Be Positive

Maybe you've had a rough day and all you want to do is curl up in a cave and vegetate for a little while. Then just take a deep breath, take a few moments to relax, commit this time to the Lord, and then jump in with a positive attitude. After a few minutes, a special time with your family can change how you feel.

Be Willing

Your children will only go as far as you go, which means, if you only do the activity halfway, they'll only do it halfway too. Be willing to get down on the floor, to get inside the tent, to throw a pillow or make a paper airplane. They may not remember all the things you tell them, but you're making memories that will last a lifetime.

Don't Pull Out the Pulpit

Don't preach. This should be an interactive time where the whole family can talk and discuss.

Don't Bore

Most of these sessions are short, fast-paced and to the point. Don't drag them out. Length of time and spirituality are not one-in-the-same. So don't talk long and don't pray long.

Don't Ru\$h

Even though these sessions are set up to be short, if your family is enjoying themselves, don't cut it off too soon. Don't be in a hurry to move on to whatever comes next in your life. And if it's that favorite TV show, just remember that God gave us DVRs for a reason...right?

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Don't Make it a Burden

These sessions have been written trying to use items that most people already have in their houses. Imagine a group walking through a house and saying, "Everyone has toilet paper. So how can we use toilet paper to teach kids about Jesus?" Now you have an idea how many of these activities developed! You don't have to prepare or study to lead these. Just open up the session and get started. It's as simple as that.

Listen Up

During these sessions you'll be asking your children a lot of questions. Listen closely and be careful not to cut them off, talk down to them or correct them in a manner that will make them hesitant to share in later sessions. Sometimes we jump to fix things without fully listening.

Keep it Up

Make a commitment, put it on your calendar, and stick to it. Let this become a favorite time of the week and a top priority. After all, what is more important than what you are about to do with your family?

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Week 1—Special Time Temptation Tools

You will need

1 Nail A magnet Some paper clips or something else that is small and metal. A Bible marked at Matthew 4:3-11

STEP 1

Try to pick up the paper clips by touching them with the nail. It won't work.

STEP 2

Now hold the magnet to the head of the nail and touch the point to the paper clips. What happened? What changed?

POINT: Just like the magnet gave the nail the ability to pick up the paper clips, God gives you the ability and the strength to say no to doing wrong things. The magnet became a tool to help the nail pick up the paper clips and God has given you a tool to help you say no to temptation.

Read Psalm 119:11 from your Bible.

Big Questions

What tool does this verse mention that helps you keep away from doing bad things?

What other tools has God given you to help keep you away from sin? (Your parents, Sunday School teachers, Christian friends, etc.)

Bible Story: Read Matthew 4:3-11 What tool did Jesus use when He was tempted?

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Self-Control

Someone who has self-control is able to control their thoughts and appetites. For example, if the boy in the story would have had self-control, he would have been able to control his desire for more beans. But self-control goes far beyond the dinner table. God wants you to have the kind of self-control where you resist bad thoughts, wrong desires and temptations and always do what is right instead.

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Week 2—Special Time Possible or Impossible?

You will need A piece of paper A book A piece of tape A Bible marked at Philippians 4:13

Try to figure this out: How can one piece of paper hold up an entire book?

Try this experiment to find out how:

Take one piece of regular paper. Roll it up to look like a toilet paper or paper towel tube. Then use a piece of tape to hold the roll in place. Set it on a flat surface so that it stands up tall. Then carefully place the book on top of it.

The paper did something you might have thought was impossible at first. But just remember that with God all things are possible and the Lord will never call you to do anything that He will not also give you the strength you need to do it.

Read Philippians 4:13

<u>PRAY</u>—That your kids will always follow Jesus and trust Him for everything they'll ever need in life.

Someone who is content realizes that true joy doesn't come from what you own or wear or even what you can do. When you've given your life to Jesus and are walking with Him, He'll always take care of you—you'll never lack for what He desires to give you and the life you'll find in Him is beyond anything you could have ever imagined. God will always give you everything you need to do anything that He calls you to do. The Bible says in Matthew 6:33, "But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." 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Week 3—Special Time Walking in Darkness

You will need Something to use as a blindfold A Bible marked at 2 Corinthians 4:4

Get Started

Take turns blindfolding each member of the family to see if they can walk from one end of the house to the other without touching anything. The second time you do this, let each person have a guide to help him.

ASK: Which was easier—having a guide or not having a guide?

SAY: Did you know that Christians—those who have given their lives to Jesus—become guides for those who don't know Christ, to lead others to Him.

Read 2 Corinthians 4:4

SAY: The Bible says that those who don't know Jesus are blind to the things of God. That's the reason they need someone to show them the way to Christ so He can bring His light and love into their lives.

Read Acts 16:16-34

ASK: How did Paul and Silas get the chance to share Jesus with the jailer? (Through several bad things that happened—including being beaten and put in jail. God will always give you the strength to live for Him.)

KEY—God can even use the bad things that happen to you to give you the chance to show His light and love to others.

<u>PRAY</u>—That God will use every member of your family to be a guide to lead others to Jesus.

Week 4—Special Time Clean Pennies, Clean Hearts

You will need

A few dirty pennies Some hot sauce A Bible turned to 1 John 1:9 **NOTE: If you don't have these items**, you can do the following to make the same point: Make a mess and clean it up. There are number of fun ways to do this—Play in the mud outside, have a shaving cream fight, have a paper-wad fight, fix a meal together or cookies (it always makes a mess in my kitchen!) or just jump in when someone accidentally spills their milk. Then begin at the DISCUSSION section below.

STEP 1:

Set out several dirty pennies on a plate.

STEP 2

Pour hot sauce on the tops of all but one of them.

STEP 3

Wait about four minutes and then wipe and wash them off.

STEP 4

Compare the pennies to the one you didn't put hot sauce on. Do you see the difference?

DISCUSSION

A person who has given his or her life to Jesus has been cleaned from their sins. Their sins are gone just like the dirtiness that we just cleaned up. But this doesn't mean that they will be perfect. When a Christian does something wrong, even though he is already saved, he still needs to ask for forgiveness. Why? Not to go to heaven. Someone who is saved is going to heaven and nothing can change that, but to have a good relationship with God.

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ASK: **Are you still part of the same family?** Of course. When you give your life to Jesus, you become a part of God's family and nothing can change that.

ASK: So if you do something wrong, are you still a part of God's family? Of course—just like you would still be brother and sister and part of the same family, even though you did something wrong.

ASK: But if you punched your brother (or sister) in the nose, would you be right with them? No You punched him in the nose!

ASK: So what would you have to do to get right with each other? Say you're sorry. When you do wrong things in life, even though you're still going to heaven, you still need to ask for forgiveness (say you're sorry) to clean up your relationship with God.

Read 1 John 1:9

This verse will tell you what to do when you do something wrong.

<u>*PRAY*</u>—And thank God for providing a way to take your sins away—to be forgiven.

You will need A deck of cards Dominoes or blocks A Bible marked at Matthew 14:22-33 and 7:24-27

Read Matthew 14:22-33

Moderation

Moderation means that you know when to stop. So just because you *can* eat twelve candy bars, doesn't mean that you should eat twelve candy bars. Moderation draws a line that says, "Even though I can do something, too much of it, even if it's good, can be bad for me." Some people have trouble eating too much, watching too much TV, or playing too many video games. These are just a few examples of where some people might need to show more moderation.

The Bible says in 1 Corinthians 6:12, "Everything is permissible for me'—but not everything is beneficial. 'Everything is permissible for me'—but I will not be mastered by anything." In other words, the only thing that should have control over your life is Jesus Christ. And, swoosh, there it goes, Down to his belly, Before the smell hits his nose. 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Week 7—Special Time Resurrection Power

<u>You will need</u>

Lemon juice Baking Soda Tissue Teaspoon measure A clean, 16-oz bottle Water A Cork or something to plug the top of the bottle. Paper Towels Tape A Bible marked at 1 Corinthians 15:55-57 NOTE: For this experiment, safety goggles are recommended for whoever shakes up the bottle. During the reaction make sure the bottle is not pointed at anyone. NOTE: If you don't have these items, you can do a different activity that is explained in the Other Option section below:

STEP 1

Go outside. Pour half an inch of lemon juice into a clean, empty 16-oz bottle. Then fill the bottle with water until it is almost half full.

STEP 2

Put a teaspoon of Baking Soda into a square of tissue and fold it like a packet.

STEP 3

Cut two strips of a paper towel and tape them to the top of a cork.

STEP 4

Drop the packet of Baking Soda into the bottle. Put the cork in the top and tape the paper towel strips to both sides of the bottle.

STEP 5

(Parent) Shake the bottle and stand back.

KEY—The lemon juice and the baking soda react with one another to create a power that shoots the cork into the air. In the same way that the bottle couldn't contain this power, the grave couldn't contain Jesus. His power was greater than sin and death. He conquered them both and made a way for us to follow Him and go to heaven forever.

Read 1 Corinthians 15:55-57

<u>PRAY</u>—Thank Jesus for loving you so much that He died on the cross and then defeated death and the grave to make a way for you both to go to heaven and to share in His life.

Other Option

Do this activity if you don't have the items you need for the one above. <u>You will need</u> Several sheets of Paper

Make a paper airplane and take turns throwing it as far as you can. Also, make some paper wads and see if you can throw them further than the airplanes. There is a limit to how far both of these can go, but there is no limit to God's power. He is allpowerful, so powerful that he defeated even death.

Now she talks, But she always listens too. Her talking-all-the-time days, Are finally through.

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Quietness

Some people never take time to stop, be quiet and listen for God's voice. Sometimes God speaks to you through the Bible. Sometimes God speaks to you through someone else. And sometimes God speaks to you through His Holy Spirit. This is like a voice inside the stillness of your heart and what He says will always line up with His Word. So... shhhhhhhh... take time to be quiet and pray and think about God.

The Bible says in Ecclesiastes 3:1 & 8, "There is a time for everything...a time to be silent and a time to speak."

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Week 8—Special Time Rolled Away

You will need Something that can be easily blown like a balloon, a ping-pong ball, a leaf, etc. A rock or stone or something that cannot be blown. Something like string, thread, or yarn to make a circle on the floor. (If you don't have any of these, then use several pairs of shoes stretching the shoelaces around in a circle.) A Bible marked at Luke 24:1-7

Get Started

Take turns blowing the balloon (or ping-pong ball or whatever item can be easily blown) into the circle. For something such as a balloon, start in a different room but for harder items, such as a leaf, start closer to the circle. See how fast they can move the item into the circle. Then take the rock (or the item that cannot be blown) and put it just a few inches from the circle. Ask them to blow it in. Let your whole family try—even at the same time. No matter what you do, you won't be able to move it without picking it up.

SAY: After Jesus died, they buried him in a cave-like tomb with a huge rock that covered the opening. Three days later some women were coming to the tomb when they realized that they hadn't planned on having to roll the stone away.

ASK: What do you think they did?

SAY: They didn't have to do anything. The stone had already been moved. When Jesus rose from the dead, the stone was rolled away. Jesus defeated death so that we could share His life.

The Bible says in Romans 12:9, "Love must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good."

A LATER TATER

<u>You will need</u>

Coffee Filter Lemon Juice A highlighter A Bible marked at 1 John 1:9 (NOTE: If you don't have these items, you can do the following to make the same point: Use food items or shaving cream to make a beard and mustache on your child—it'll make a mess on them, just like sin makes a mess out of our lives. Then see how fast they can clean up their faces. Read 1 John 1:9 and continue with the discussion below.

STEP 1

Use a highlighter to write different sins on a coffee filter.

STEP 2

Put a few drops of lemon juice on the filter and watch your sins disappear.

SAY: Sin always makes a mess in our lives but if we confess our sins and tell God we're sorry for the wrong things we've done, He'll forgive us. We can't clean ourselves up; We can't forgive our own sins—we need a Savior. You will need An old comic book or newspaper White Silly Putty or you can make your own with the following items: A container White glue Liquid starch A spoon A Bible marked at Matthew 5:16 (NOTE: If you don't have these items, you can use a mirror to reflect light with the same italicized and underlined key point below. Take turns reflecting light at different targets. Who are some people who need to see the light of Jesus?)

STEP 1

Mix two parts glue with one part liquid starch. Stir well.

STEP 2

Keep adding starch one spoonful at a time, while working it with your fingers, until it becomes a putty-like mixture.

STEP 3

Put the putty onto an old comic book or newspaper. Press down and then peel it off. What changed?

Now it shows whatever words or pictures you pressed it on. *In the same way, once people meet Jesus (give their lives to Him), they become a reflection of who He is.* Read the verses below and think about ways you show Jesus to others who don't know Him.

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Responsibility

People who are responsible correctly take care of tasks that are given to them. For example, if your mom says, "Keep your room clean," and you keep it clean, you've shown responsibility. But what about someone who gets a pet and promises to feed it every day but keeps forgetting? Are they being responsible? No. God wants us to be responsible and to do everything as if we are doing it for Him. Listen to what the Bible says in Colossians 3:17, "And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him."

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Week 12—Special Time Oh, What a Change!

You will need Green and Yellow food coloring (Red and blue will work also.) 2 cups Water A Bible marked at 2 Corinthians 5:17 NOTE: If you don't have these items, you can do a different activity that is explained in the *Other Option* section below:

STEP 1

Pour two glasses of water. In one put a few drops of green (or blue) food coloring. With each drop say something bad that people do (i.e., tell a lie, take something that belongs to someone else, throw a fit, disobey mom or dad, etc.) This green (or blue) cup stands for all the bad things we do.

STEP 2

In the second cup of water, add a few drops of yellow (or red) food coloring. The yellow stands for the streets of gold in heaven. (If you use red, it stands for the blood Jesus shed when He died to make a way for us to go to heaven.) This cup stands for Jesus and how He died to make a way for us to go to heaven and to take away all the wrong things we've done.

STEP 3

Now pour the cup representing Jesus (yellow or red) into the cup that represents our sins (green or blue). There is a big change. When someone gives their life to Jesus, there is a big change that happens because: (1) that person is adopted into God's family, (2) they are given God's Holy Spirit to guide and direct them, (3) they are given an eternal life that nothing can ever take away, and (4) God gives them a brand new kind of life.

Other Option

Do this activity if you don't have the items you need for the one above.

Make some cookies or biscuits and point out the change that happens while cooking. You might even want to do a before and after taste-test. Or, pop some popcorn and compare a kernel with the end result—A taste-test here is recommended only for the final product! Or, get a little messy by adding water to a nicely folded pile of toilet paper. This is guaranteed to make a change. Then begin with the discussion below.

DISCUSSION: The change you just saw doesn't even begin to compare with the change that Jesus makes when a person gives his or her life to Him.






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Step Two: Sin-Our Problem

How to Lead Your Child to Christ

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


Explain that we have a problem. Our problem is sin and sin is anything we do that is wrong.

ASK: **Have you ever done something wrong?** (Be careful not to ask, "Have you ever sinned?" Some children aren't familiar with the term "sin." Ask, "Have you ever done anything wrong?")

Explain that everyone is a sinner and sin (the wrong things we do) separates us from God, just like in the drawing. "Picture this as a Grand Canyon or Great Wall that separates you from God. You see, God is perfect. He's on this side. Are we perfect? No, because we've all done wrong things."

Romans 3:23 – "For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God."



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Important Note about the Stage of Accountability

On *Step Two* of the drawing if a child cannot yet discern right from wrong, he has not yet reached the stage of accountability and is not ready to give his life to Christ. In this event, plant a seed for the future:

"You know, Johnny, there will be a time in your life when you do something that's wrong. When that time comes, know that God still loves you and has made a way for you to go to heaven. And, Johnny, if you ever start thinking about heaven and how you can go there, come talk to me."

At this time DO NOT pray with him that he'll accept Christ when the time is right. Many people do this without realizing that they are dealing with a young child who may only remember that he talked with somebody about Jesus and someone prayed with him. We don't want to do anything that might cause doubt in the future.

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

Romans 6:23 - "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord."

Explain that there is a punishment for the wrong things we do. This punishment is eternal separation from God in a place called "hell." God didn't create hell for us, but for the devil and the other angels that rebelled against Him. But when we sinned and rebelled against God, this became our just punishment too.

ASK: But where does God want us to go? (To Heaven.)


But just because He wants us to go there, doesn't mean that we automatically will.

Importants: When speaking with a child, do not omit mentioning hell because it is a part of the Gospel. However, do not focus on this. Your aim is not to scare your child, but to inform them that there is a punishment for sin and a gift that is heaven. Also, you may need to distinguish with some children that "hell" is a "bad" word if you hit your thumb with a hammer and then say it, but it is also a place.

How to Lead Your Child to Christ

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
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Step Four: One Way

Add to the drawing:



Explain that Jesus was God and came to earth as a man. He lived a perfect life, and when He died, God punished Him for all the wrong things you and I would ever do. This is how much God loves you and this is the reason Jesus came, to make a way for you to go to heaven. *(Refer to the sin block.)* If this is the Grand Canyon of sin, Jesus built a bridge across it by dying and paying the price for your sins, but Jesus didn't stay dead. Three days later, God raised Him from the dead and He's alive today. That's why He's the only way to go to heaven.


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Step Five: Gift Illustration

Add NOTHING to the drawing:

Explain that salvation is a gift.

Ephesians 2:8-9 – "For by grace you have been saved through faith and that not of yourselves; it is a gift of God. Not of works, lest any man should boast."

(You can also refer back to Romans 6:23)

Gift Illustration:

Let's say this pen (the pen you've been writing with) is worth a million dollars and I come to you one day and say, "I'd like to give this to you." Is it yours yet? What would you have to do to get it? (If they don't immediately say, "I have to reach out and take it," guide them toward that answer.)

Like a gift, you can accept it, or you can say no. A gift can't be earned, just like heaven – you can't be good enough to get to heaven. *(Refer back to the drawing)* There is only one way across that Grand Canyon of sin, and that's Jesus.

Now with the pen, it would be easy for you to take it. All you have to do is reach out and it's yours. With God's gift, it's a little different – You can't physically reach out and take it, but in the Bible God told us how we can accept this gift. You see, Jesus paid the price for our sins; what we have to do is give our lives to Him and accept Him as our Lord and Savior.

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This is how a person can give his life to Jesus:

Admit that we have sinned and be willing to turn from our sin.

Believe that Jesus is God's Son who died and was raised from the dead.

Call on the Lord, confess our sins, and commit our life to Him.

The Bible says:

Romans 10:9 - "That if you will confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved."

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Step Six: The Invitation

BIG QUESTIONS:

ASK: Does all this make sense to you?

ASK: Would you like to give your life to Christ?

If NO, ask why not?

If YES, then let them pray aloud or lead them in a prayer similar to the following: (Remember, there is no magic prayer. Words don't save a person; God knows what is in their heart.)

Dear Jesus,

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In Jesus Name, Amen.

After your child accepts Jesus, immediately congratulate him and give him a big hug. Let him know how proud and happy you are. Then encourage him to continue growing with Jesus, to make his decision public at church, and to follow the Lord in baptism.

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
