Game: **Big Choices - Which Voices** Discussion: **Jesus is the Truth** Scripture: **John 14:6** YOU WILL NEED: 1 blindfold; a cup of water (optional)

Big Choices - Which Voices

Choose one volunteer. Divide your class into two teams and have them sit on both sides of the volunteer.

Blindfold your volunteer. Then hide a music CD (or some other object) somewhere in the room. Say, "This side will tell the truth about where the CD is hidden" and point to one side. Then say, "This side will try to misguide our volunteer." Point to the other side. In other words, both sides will try to guide the volunteer but only one side is guiding him the correct way. He'll have to choose which side he is going to follow. Give a couple of students the opportunity to play. Whoever finds the CD first, gets to keep it. (And, if you want to exemplify "grace", when you get something although you don't deserve it, then have a CD for each of them.)

Discussion

Ask the students: How did you know which side was telling the truth?

<u>Ask the students</u>: **How do you know Jesus will always tell you the truth?** (Because He is perfect; Because the Bible tells you so, etc.)

SAY: Jesus doesn't just tell the truth; He is the Truth. There's a big difference.

Illustration

For example, (if you want, hold up a glass of water), I can say, "I have a glass of water." But it's a completely different concept to say, "I am a glass of water." I can say, "I have love," but God can say that He is love. I can say, I have the truth or I know the truth, but Jesus can say, "I AM the truth."

SAY: Jesus is perfect and He cannot and will not ever lie to you or point you in the wrong way. You can truth WHO He is.

Have the students repeat after you: Jesus is the Truth!

Read John 14:6
